99% of people in the whole world are not refugees



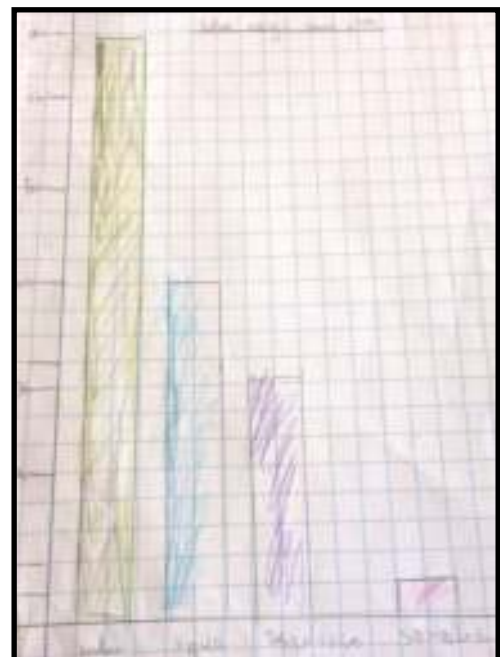
Where do refugees come from?

Afghanistan: 3,000,000 (3 million)

Somalia: 1,000,000 (1 million)

Sudan: 700,000 (seven hundred thousand)



Where do refugees flee to (where do they go to be safe)?

Jordan: 3,000,000 (3 million)

Turkey: 2,500,000 (2.5 million)

Pakistan: 2,000,000 (2 million)

Lebanon: 1,500,000 (1.5 million)
