

# SAFEGUARDING AND CHILD PROTECTION AT SHOREDITCH PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL

## What is Child Protection about?

At Shoreditch Park Primary School, all of the adults around you think that your health, safety and wellbeing are very important. In our school we respect our children and want to keep you safe and help to protect your rights.

We do our best to help you to make good progress in your learning and to be happy. We teach you how to recognise risks in different situations and how to protect yourselves and stay safe. We are a Rights Respecting School and we ensure that every child has access to their rights.

**Article 3** – (best interests of the child) The best interests of the child must be a top priority in all actions concerning children.

**Article 4** – (protection of rights) Governments must do all they can to fulfil the rights of every child. Our Aspire Curriculum is at the heart of all that we do. Aspire helps us all to be safe, healthy and happy at school.

## How will we try to protect you?

We try to provide a safe environment for you to learn in. We want to ensure you remain safe, at home as well as in school.

We think it is important for you to know where to get help if you are worried or unhappy about something. If you need to talk, we will listen.

## Who can you talk to?

If you are worried about something you can talk to an adult in school. This could be your teacher or any of the Designated Safeguarding Leads.
